a. Discuss and act upon the Proposed FY 2021-22 Budget

Members discussed various items including but not limited to potential line items to cut, revenue relief funds, capital projects, Resident State Trooper, town's operational budget, etc.

Diane Choquette MOVED to reduce the Andover Elementary School budget by \$138k.

Discussion: Members discussed various reasoning behind the budget cut.

Superintendent Valerie Bruneau shared information in support of the AES budget.

MOTION CARRIED 5:1:1

Curt Dowling, Diane Choquette, Linda Fish, David Hewett and Louise Goodwin voted in favor of. Rob England voted not in favor of. Marc Brinker abstained.

David Hewett MOVED to have 4 yes or no questions added to the Referendum ballot:

- 1. Is the Andover Elementary School budget too high?
- 2. Should the Resident State Trooper be cut to lower the town budget?
- 3. Should the town cut services to lower the budget?
- 4. Should capital be reduced to lower the town budget?

Curt Dowling SECONDED

Discussion: Members discussed the responses being helpful whether the Referendum does or does not pass.

MOTION CARRIED 7:0:0

Rob England MOVED to remove the Resident State Trooper line item of \$176k.

MOTION NOT SECONDED

Curt Dowling MOVED to reduce the capital Road Improvement Fund by \$25k.

Rob England SECONDED

Discussion: Members discussed the ramifications of the capital fund reduction.

MOTION CARRED 7:0:0

Louise Goodwin MOVED to recommend the revised proposed town budget.

Diane Choquette SECONDED

MOTION CARRIED 6:0:1 Rob England abstained.

The estimated proposed mil rate is 36.41 with a 2.24% increase. The revised proposed town budget will be available on the town website and in the Town Clerk's Office following the meeting.

PUBLIC SPEAK

Public Speak #1:

I would like to make a couple of important points before this meeting starts, I will be brief, but also since we are taking time out to be present, I appreciate the opportunity to speak. My hope is that

the current BOF members have arrived here today ready to do the hard work after the proposed budget failed at referendum. The BOF is elected based on the town residents putting their faith in them to

make these hard, tough decisions. It is clear that the current 6.7% taxation increase is too much for the tax

payers to take on due to the reduced revenue and less surplus funds used this year. This will be an ongoing situation, so it needs to be looked at now. I have advocated from the beginning, followed by

tons of facts, that the AES budget should be reduced to a zero increase due to decreasing enrollment and cost comparison with multiple other surrounding Towns, as well as research I have done on

Towns all over CT. Many attempts have been made by the BOF to the BOE for possible scenarios for cuts of varying amounts. To this date, nothing has been submitted. I have called this a strategy

by them in order to not show their cards to the Town. I want to make it clear that the word strategy is not a bad word at all. I often use strategies in certain situations. So, now it is up to the BOF to

make those cuts themselves. I attended the last BOE meeting, which referenced a \$138,000 surplus or funds that were left. I would like to see that money used to purchase some items from

this proposed budget like they did with leftover money last year. It would be a big help. Overall, I would like to see a \$200,000 cut to this proposed Town budget, which would then leave the taxpayers with

a 4.5% tax increase and not the current 6.7% increase. I think it can be done.

Lastly, to parents out there listening. Please don't equate money with a good education. You hold a very big key to your child's success when you partner with your school system. If you send well

behaved, respectful children to school ready to learn, their teacher will teach them without constant interruptions to the day to correct behavior issues in class. I rasied three children in Town, who have

all went on to graduate with degrees from college and are doing quite well. They had classes of at least 20 students in them in elementary school. Again, we are not looking to cut millions from the budget,

just approximately \$200,000 in my opinion to lower the cost to taxpayers. There are many schools in CT that have much higher enrollment and their budget is much lower than AES. I also support

a good education for our students and I work in a school. Thank you and good luck!
