

Municipal Grant Requests Greater Together Community Funds

The Hartford Foundation will consider grant requests from federal, state or municipal government agencies or departments for activities that can advance the Foundation's mission, values and strategic priorities that cannot otherwise be funded through tax dollars, reimbursement or other sources of funding on a case-by-case basis.

Foundation dollars are meant to be additive in nature and should not supplant/replace/supersede existing sources of funding when sufficient public resources are available.

Grant Requests to Greater Together Community Funds:

Greater Together Community Fund advisory committees can consider municipal grant requests. The parameters that need to be considered are:

- Greater Together Community Funds should not supplant/replace/supersede existing sources of public dollars
- Foundation dollars are meant to be additive in nature

Who decides if the municipal grant is approved for Greater Together Community Funds?

Just as it is set up with any request for funding from its Greater Together Community Fund, it is up to the Greater Together Community Fund advisory committee to make the decision as to whether to approve a municipal grant request based on the parameters set above and any other requirements set up for grant requests by the advisory committee.
