C. Randazzo made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 1, 2024 Regular Committee Meeting, seconded by S. Becker. No discussion.

6. Sub Committee Updates

A. Engineering Committee:

- C. Randazzo, M. Russo, and E. Anderson met to discuss whether there will be a need for RFP bids and previous soccer field work completed by CLA Engineering. Should CLA Engineering were contracted to complete the survey and costs were below \$15,000 there would be no need for additional RFPs. If costs were above \$15,000, a second option would be to work with the town's engineer.
- 2. Additional discussion centered around the exact dimensions/requirements for the pickleball courts and playground area with specifications provided to Christine within the week. C. Randazzo provided a suggested playground design, Kloter

Farms as an option for Pavillion designs, and reiterated that site work/grading/trenching to be completed by Andover's public works department.

B. Playground Committee:

- 1. B. Gadomski visited Blish Park's playground in Marlborough. Their playscape is a "Kloter Farms" pressure treated wood design.
- 2. S. Becker shared several playscape design companies:
- a. AES's PTA is working with McRectime(?) to update the school's playscape will contact someone on the PTA to find out what will be included for the school so that the town's playscape will offer different "activities" for kids.
- b. Creative Creations town of Hebron is using this company.
- c. Landscape Structures' local affiliate is O'Brine and Sons
- d. Play By Design offers community builds volunteers will be needed to construct the playscape.
- e. Additional discussion centered around the location/square footage of the playground and insuring the playground is truly accessible for all.

C. Pickleball Committee:

- 1. S. Person met with the Hebron Parks and Rec representative and shared the following:
- a. WIII use a paving company for the courts
- b. Fencing contractors with the state of Connecticut
- c. Estimated cost \$120,000 including 10 ft fence and additional \$45,000 for light
- d. Possibility of expanding the area to include a tennis court

D. Fundraising Committee:

- A. M. Russo shared the following opportunities for community support
- 1. Hartford Foundation of Giving provides grants for community projects
- 2. Currently have an anonymous donor perhaps reach out to community for matching donations
- 3. AARP grants for pickleball
- 4. Community members may elect to donate a bench, equipment, "buy a brick" for the pathway

7. New Business Items:

- A. J. Nunes shared about her visit to Adam's Adventure in Tolland. Special notes: plaques to recognize donors and nice pavilion.
- B. Additional committee members: B. Gadomski and J. Nunes were added to the playground committee
- C. For planning purposes, the playground committee and pickleball committee will each receive an estimated \$100,000.

- A. Provide schematics to C. Randazzo ASAP so that the Engineering committee can move ahead with their work.
